The Certificate in Economy and Culture is designed for students wishing to develop their expertise in the cultural and ethnographic analysis of economic processes and systems. Courses offer intensive training in non-western and non-capitalist economic practices, as well as anthropological approaches to contemporary capitalisms. The Certificate program is also intended for students interested in cross-cultural approaches to economic management and planning.

Requirements:

- 1. Complete (or expect to complete) three (3) courses by graduation. The following courses are eligible for this certificate:

 - 41A Origins of Global Interdependence
 - 50B Gender and Global Health
 - 121A Kinship and Social Organization
 - 125A Economic Anthropology
 - 125B Ecological Anthropology

 - 125X Transnational Migration
 - 128C Culture, Power, and Cyberspace
 - 129X Special Topic on Social and Economic Anthropology (by petition to the Undergraduate Advisor, depending on the topic)
- 2. Attain a 3.0 GPA minimum in the three (3) courses that you take to fulfill the requirements for the Certificate program
- 3. Attend three (3) Anthropology Colloquia and write a one page report and/or analysis. Summaries will be reviewed and evaluated by the Undergraduate Advisor. It is your responsibility to plan ahead and attend colloquia BEFORE you submit your certificate application. For a schedule of colloquia, see www.anthro.uci.edu.
