## Major in Anthropology Application for Honors Program 2011-2012

The Honors Program in Anthropology is open to junior and senior majors in Anthropology with an overall grade point average of 3.3 and a 3.5 in the major. Students formally apply to the Honors Program at the end of the junior year or beginning of the senior year.

The following are the requirements for the Honors Program:

- The selection of a faculty advisor who is willing to supervise the student's honors thesis project. The faculty advisor MUST sign this form for the student to be admitted into the Honors Program. The faculty advisor must be a full time regular faculty member in the Anthropology Department. Any other potential advisor is subject to the approval of the Undergraduate Director.
- Enrollment in Anthropology H190A in the Fall of the year in which the student will
  graduate; Anthropology H190B in the Winter; and H191W in the Spring, during which
  time the student will complete a written senior thesis under the direction of his or her
  faculty advisor.
- Adherence to the following deadlines, which are firm:
  - -October 10, 2011 Application to honors program due, SSPB 4231
  - -December 13, 2011 Full research proposal due, delivered to your advisor
  - -March 19, 2012 AT MINIMUM, a complete outline with chapter or section abstracts due, delivered to your advisor
  - -May 14, 2012 Full draft of thesis due, delivered to your advisor
  - -June 4, 2012 Final thesis due, delivered to your advisor
