Courses offer training in legal, political and cultural dimensions of civil society and political participation in the democratic process.

All certificates will be awarded at a special reception toward the end of Spring quarter.

- 1. Complete (or expect to complete) **three** (3) of the following courses by graduation. Additional courses may also count toward this certificate.

 - 136A Nationalism and Ethnicity in the Contemporary World
 - 136D Conflict Management in Cross-Cultural Perspective
 - 139 Prisons and Public Education
 - 161T Field Research: Asian Immigrants, and Refugees in Orange County
 - 162B Indian North America
 - 169A China and Globalization
 - GSS Gen&Sex 60B: Gender and Law
 - CLS Criminology, Law and Society courses; by petition to the Undergrad Director
- 2. Attain a 3.0 GPA minimum in the **three** (3) courses that you take to fulfill the requirements for the Certificate program
- 3. Attend **three** (3) Anthropology Colloquia, and write a report and/or analysis of the event. These should be **between 300-500 words**. Summaries will be reviewed and evaluated by the Undergraduate Director. It is your responsibility to plan ahead and attend colloquia BEFORE you submit your certificate application. NOTE: If you're applying for multiple certificates, you only need to submit three (3) summaries *TOTAL*


